Born Oct. 21, 1907, in Manistee and raised in Sand Lake, the former Mary Bartosiewicz joined the Sisters of Mercy in Grand Rapids at age 17. For some years she was known as Sister Mary Mathew.

By age 20 she was teaching third and fourth grades at St. Casimir School, Posen, the beginning of 64 years of teaching and coaching little ones. She earned degrees from Mercy College and the University of Detroit and did extensive post-graduate work in reading instruction.

Sister Marianne's life revolved around the children - she delighted in them, and they in her. One of her very successful techniques, according to Sister Mary Bernadette Grimm, was her teaching of phonics using nursery rhymes, and often done in a Mother Goose outfit.

She had a sunny persona which was contagious, and was throughout her religious life a generous, life-enhancing member of her community.

Besides Posen, Sister Marianne taught primary grades at St. Michael, Muskegon; St. Ignace, Rogers City; St. Patrick, Ada; St. Elizabeth, Reese; Holy Cross, Lansing; and served as a Title I aide for the Howell Public Schools. She also taught at St. Rita, Carrizozo, N.M.

From 1972-78, she presided over a reading laboratory at Mercy College of Detroit. She also taught at St. Anselm, Dearborn; Our Lady of LaSalle, Berkeley, and in Detroit at St. Monica and Immaculate Heart of Mary, where from 1985-91, she also served as tutor, school librarian and office assistant until she retired to prayer ministry at McAuley Center.

Sister Marianne is survived by sister, Elizabeth Migocki of Macomb Township; brother, Francis of Manistee; many nieces and nephews; and the sisters of her community.
