reason to the selection of channels."
Competition is not the panacea everyone thinks, said Bill Hartsock, SWOCC chairman and Farmington City Council member. Studies show rates drop and more channels are added at first.
"Then things start to even off and the rates start to rise again," Hartsock said.
Public access supporters and public school officials lobbied heavily for new equipment and more channels.
Producers of community access program complained of outdated equipment while school officials want separate channels for their respective districts. Farmington, Novi and Clarencville share one channel.
Clarencville district includes a southeastern portion of Farmington Hills.
"We need to establish our identity," said Sharon McDonald, a Clarencville media specialist

and Farmington Hills resident. "People often get confused about the three districts sharing one channel."
A Farmington Public Schools media specialist complained about obsolete equipment. Some cameras have "tubes the size of my hand," said Peggy Schmidt, Farmington Schools media specialist.
Bob Maxfield joined Clarencville and Novi superintendents in a show of support for more school district access. District officials feel let down.
"We were all caught up in the romantic vision of what cable television could bring to communities," Maxfield said. "We hope that we will have a cable provider that is consistent with the high quality of this community, one that shares that vision

... a vision that is truly is expected, respected and we would expect to delivered to everyone in this community."
At least 40 people spoke during the hearing. About seven to eight others logged their views regarding Time Warner's performance on video tape. SWOCC also received 16 letters.
All of those will be included in a report that is going to part of a request for a proposal from Time Warner.
In terms of complaints over spiraling cable rates, Hartsock suggested public contact with U.S. Congress, which oversees the Federal Communications Commission.
Not all are dissatisfied. A Hill couple that operates a Redford print shop where Time Warner does business spoke highly of the cable company's performance.
"I want to give them a vote of confidence," said Walter Crop.
