The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has launched its fourth annual Youth Media Contest to encourage young people across the nation to employ their media savvy and creativity to uncover the fact and fiction regarding tobacco use. The contest, Tobacco-The Truth Unfiltered, continues through March 22.

"This year's contest will give students the opportunity to seek out for themselves the truth about tobacco," said Michael Eriksen, director of CDC's Office on Smoking and Health. "We hope this project will inspire young people across the country to speak out against tobacco use."

Awards will be given for best news story feature article, editorial/commentary, editorial carteon, TV and radio public service onnouncement, web site design, poster, essay, and educational video. Students may entermore than one category. Finalists will be judged by a panel of professional journalists and celebrity volunteers. Winners will be announced mid-May.

First-place winners will have their winning entries included in a national tobacco control Media Campaign Resource Center or promoted nationally on various Internet sites.



Please contact your adolescent's middle school or high school about this contest. You can make a real difference in students lives by urging the teacher at your school who is in charge of teaching health to utilize the contests as a practical exercise. This is a great opportunity for teens to find out the hard facts about nicotine addiction, the chemicals in tobacco amoke, and how tobacco companies market to hem.

Is your teen smoking?

On a personal note, if your teen has started to smoke, the road to helping them quit smok-



quitting takes between 7 and 17 tries for teens.

One first step would be to take your teen to your physician. Talk to your doctor about your teen's smoking. Richard B. Heyman, M.D., F.A.A.P., chairs the American Academy of Pediatrics' Committee on Substance Abuse. He says, "If your teen is truly committed to quitting, nicotine replacement therapy can be used." Most teens usually prefer the patgh.

Talk with your teen's school leaders and urge that a support group, lead by a professional, be established at your school. Teens can quit smoking with support. Families can initiate finding help.

Be sure to talk to your adolescents about the pressures they are experiencing to smoke. Role-play how to refuse tobacc — don't be embarrassed. This exercise is very important. You can make a big difference, it is a lot casier to work on not starting to smoke than to help your teen stop.
