

POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

MARIJUANA POSSESSION

In Farmington Hills: Police arrested an Oak Park man, 40, after finding 19 grams of marijuana in the 1995 Ford F-250 truck he was driving on Orchard Lake and 14 Mile Feb. 16. Police stopped the truck for making an improper turn from Northwestern onto westbound 14 Mile.

Police arrested a Novi man, 28, after finding three plastic bags with 2 grams of marijuana inside during a traffic stop on M-5 Feb. 17. Police stopped the 1987 Ford truck for making an improper lane change.

Police arrested a Westland man, 31, after finding 4.5 grams of marijuana on the side of the road on Grand River and Middlebelt Feb. 17. Police tried to stop the 1992 Blazer for a loud exhaust when the driver threw the plastic bag on the side of the road.

HIGH SCHOOL PRANK?

In Farmington Hills: A Fiddler's Green resident found yellow caution tape wrapped around the porch surrounding ground beef and fat strips laying on top of the porch Feb. 17. Someone had also stuck plastic forks in the yard and wrote "ape." The resident told police her daughters are involved in sports at Harrison High and the incident might be a prank instigated by girls at another school.

AUTO THEFT

In Farmington Hills: Someone stole a 1996 Chevy GMT-400 from a Howard Street

residence between Feb. 14-15.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills: Someone stole six Hitachi laptops and five compact disc drives from Albin Konica on Indoplex between Feb. 1-15.

A man stole a laptop computer from Office Max on Grand River Feb. 17. He picked out a \$2,199 NEC laptop and wrote a check for it. When the employee went to examine the check, the man reached behind the counter and took the computer and walked out.

VANDALISM

In Farmington Hills: Someone threw three rocks and shattered a 6-foot by 20-foot window on the west side of Farmington Hills Manor the

night of Feb. 16-17, causing more than \$1,000 damage.

CHECKS STOLEN

In Farmington Hills: A couple simultaneously cashed two stolen checks for more than \$18,000 at Comerica on Northwestern and 13 Mile around 11 a.m. Feb. 16. The pair asked for cash and cashier's checks, which they cashed at a Comerica branch in Southfield. Bloomfield Hills police arrested the couple after they tried to cash another set of stolen checks at a Comerica in that community. The checks were stolen from a Farmington Hills legal firm.

GUN REMOVED

In Farmington Hills: Police removed a partially sawed-off shotgun from a Little

Valley Estates residence after a woman who was drunk when she was held up inside Feb. 16. Police tried to phone the woman but the line was busy. She came out of the residence without any weapons after being asked by police.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

In Farmington Hills: Police arrested a Farmington Hills man, 37, for drunken driving on 12 Mile and Middlebelt around 2:50 a.m. Feb. 18. Police stopped the 1995 Dodge Ram truck for weaving. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .13 percent. It is illegal to drive with a level of .10 percent or more.
