The man and his father investigated, and saw that it was Chomos. They then took off in his father's vehicle, chased Chomos for a couple of miles then collided near Middlebelt and Stockton. Chomos attempted to fee on foot, but was caught by Farmington Hills polico.

"We're not sure how he got to the church," Patterson said. He said police were also unsure about what prompted the other roommate to kick him out of the apartment. Chomos had no prior police record.


