"Even before Hurricane
Mitch struck, Honduras was
very impoverished nation,"
said the Rev. Louise Westfall,
associate church paster, who
led the mission along with
Joelle Wickens, church youth
director, "Yo: we saw enormous energy and hopefulness
on the part of the Hondurans

to work together to improve their lives and communities. Faith-based community orga-nizing efforts have strength-ened their ability to address problems of nutrition, health and economic development."

The group assisted with cement-block construction of houses, and building projects at a Women's Shelter near the capital city of Tegucigalpa.

They were hested by a grass-roots, faith-based Hon-duran organization known as the Christian Commission for Development, which receives

funding from Church World Service, part of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA (sponsor of CROP Walks.)

The nine adults participat-ing were from Birmingham, Bevorly Hills, Bingham Farms, and Troy; the six stu-dents were from Groves and Seaholm High Schools
