# Blues earn tournament trophy

The South Farmington Blues swept the 10-year-old division of the Sterling Heights Memorial Weekend Classic.

The Blues defeated the Coughlin Cubs, 16-8, Romeo Reds, 6-3, and Birmingham Red Sox, 6-2, to reach the finals. In the championship game, South Farmington defeated the Cubs, 9-0.
