

## POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

## THREATS

**In Farmington Hills:**  
A Hills woman told police her former boyfriend is threatening to put nude photos of her on the Internet. The pair broke up in April, but he is still upset, she said.

## ATTEMPTED BURGLARY

**In Farmington Hills:**  
A Susan Drive resident came home to find the garage door pried open July 2. A neighbor said a boy earlier asked to borrow pliers to fix his bike. The pliers had brass shavings that matched the door handles on the garage. When questioned by police, the boy said he had nothing to do with the break-in but later phoned the station to admit he did it in an attempt to get his game back.

Someone tried to break into Jeffrey Animal Hospital by kicking in the rear door at the Middlebelt Road facility July 6. Officers found a size 9 footprint on the door.

## CRIMINAL SEXUAL CONDUCT

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police arrested a Farmington Hills man, 22, after two men appeared to be engaged in a sexual act inside a 1997 Plymouth Breeze parked at Drake's Lane on Grand River on July 2. The victim, a 30-year-old Novi man, told police the driver pulled down his pants and began to fondle him against his will. The passenger, who is described as mentally impaired, told police there have been numerous incidents. The driver said the passenger did say "no," but added "Sometimes I get urges." The driver, who told police he is dyslexic, is a high school graduate and attended community college.

## MARIJUANA ARREST

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police arrested a Detroit man, 38, for driving with a suspended

license and carrying 4 grams of marijuana in the glove box of a 1976 Ford Fairmont during a traffic stop on Chesterbrook and 13 Mile July 3.

Police arrested a Livonia man, 36, after finding 29 grams of marijuana and a bong inside the 1995 Dodge van he was driving on Drake near 12 Mile July 4. Police also arrested a Livonia woman, 40, after police found nine grams of marijuana in her purse.

Police arrested a Hills male, 18, for possession with intent to deliver after finding 20 plastic bags with marijuana inside contained in his pants' pocket July 4. Officers found a 1999 Chevy S-10 parked behind Forest Elementary with two teens, including a 17-year-old passenger who was smoking weed. Altogether police confiscated 18 grams of marijuana and \$193 cash for possible drug forfeiture.

## DRUNKEN DRIVING

**In Farmington Hills:**  
A Hazel Park man, 34, proved to be a handful after being arrested for drunken driving July 5. The man, who was stopped on Middlebelt and 12 Mile, started to bang on his cell door and tried to wrestle jail keys from officers. He also tore a blanket and formed a noose around his neck. When officers took him to Botsford Hospital to have blood drawn, he tried to head butt and bite one of them, police said. Ironically, a LEIN check revealed he had no warrants and a clean driving record. His was one of numerous arrests for drunken driving during the July 4 holiday weekend.

Police arrested a Redford man, 31, for drunken driving on Grand River and Pearl at 6:24 p.m. July 3. Police stopped the 1998 GMC bread truck after getting a tip from a motorist on a cellular phone. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .14 percent, which is above the legal limit of .10 percent.

Police arrested a Livonia

man, 41, for drunken driving on Halsted and Eight Mile at 6:05 July 3. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .15 percent. Police also arrested the passenger, a Hills woman, 31, after finding partially burnt marijuana joints underneath her seat. An officer had previously seen the woman on 10 Mile and Industrial Park and then walk south of Halsted. She waved at the driver of a late model station wagon. After he pulled over, she got inside, police said. She told officers she's living at a Hills hotel and was looking for a ride back there.

Police arrested a Dearborn Heights man, 36, for drunken driving on Grand River and Waldron around 11 p.m. July 3. Officers saw the 1989 Ford Tempo weaving and nearly strike a turnaround curb. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .23 percent. Police also ticketed two passengers for having open intoxicants in the car.

Police arrested a Hills man, 41, for drunken driving on Grand River and Drake shortly after midnight July 4. Police stopped the 1993 Geo Metro for speeding. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .13 percent.

## HOUSE PARTY

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police broke up a house party on Leelanaw Street and ticketed a 17-year-old July 3. Around 11:46 p.m., officers arrived to find 10-15 minors in the front yard. Police found open beer containers but the host said those belonged to his older brother.

## CONCEALED WEAPON

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police arrested a Detroit man, 21, after finding a .25 caliber handgun in the trunk of the 1978 Chevy Caprice he was driving on westbound Grand River and Colgate July 6. Police also found 6 grams of marijuana in five separate plastic bags and open intoxicants in the vehicle. The gun had the serial number scratched off and was loaded.
