

Public safety official urges pedestrians to be cautious

Motorists often are urged to drive defensively, or to look out for the "other guy" when they're out on the road.

But perhaps people need to walk defensively, too, said Farmington Public Safety Deputy Director Mike Wiggins.

That means using sidewalks and crosswalks, avoiding the street and not being in so much of a rush to put shoe leather to pavement the instant a green "Walk" sign is illuminated.

Shortly before 11 a.m. last Wednesday, a 60-year-old Farmington woman was injured when she attempted to cross the middle of Farmington Road about one block south of Grand River.

She avoided serious injury, but only because the vehicle that struck her slowed down to about 5 miles-per-hour at the point of impact, police said.

"Pedestrians need to stay on the sidewalks and stay on the crosswalks," Wiggins said. "Don't cross the roadway where safe passage is not provided.

The rules seemingly are simple. Walkers use the crosswalks, and when they do, motorists yield to them, Wiggins explained.

But that doesn't always happen.

"Just as you drive, you should walk defensively as well," Wiggins said. "On the other hand, I

don't blindly walk out there" either when having the right of way.


(Motorists) don't always follow the lights and the signs," he added.

Wiggins said the driver of the Chevrolet pick-up truck involved in Wednesday's mishap was not ticketed.

The victim, who was treated at and released from Boutwell Hospital, sustained a severe cut to the top of her head and lost a significant amount of blood.

"An accident like it was a very fortunate set of circumstances with the slow-moving vehicle," Wiggins said.

The woman actually was injured when she struck her head on the street and not from the impact of the vehicle.

ARTHRITIS IN CHILDREN

We appreciate that children are different than adults. Rheumatoid arthritis in children exhibits the same understanding. The signs that this arthritis occurs in children is distinct, and you need awareness of the features of arthritis in children to recognize its presence in a youngster.

Rheumatoid arthritis in children expresses itself in one of three ways. The first is called systemic arthritis. The feature of this type is that the child has skin joint pain but the affected joints usually are not swollen and may get as high as 104 F. Arthritis of the liver is a condition that disappears when the fever leaves.

The second way rheumatoid arthritis appears is with pain and swelling in the hands and wrists, fingers and toes, usually like the fingers. The third form is with pain in a knee or hip, or possibly a knee and a wrist. This is only one of two forms in children. When the joints are swollen, the result is a result of an injury while playing, or possibly a result of a viral infection. However, the knee swelling may persist for weeks.
