the "English Only" policy some firms have adopted to homogenize language use on company grounds, policies which include conversations in break rooms and on the telephone.

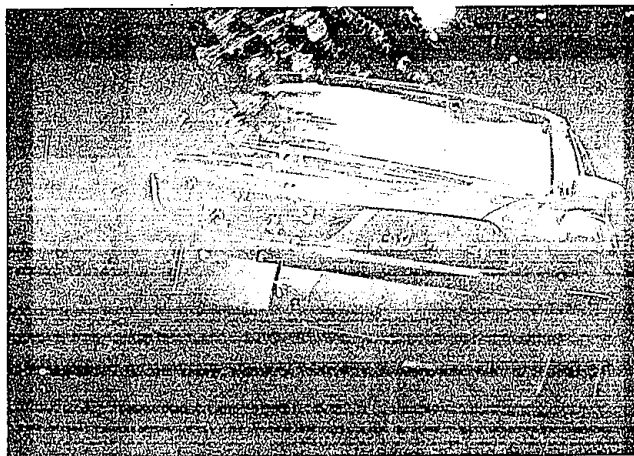
