Deregulation

Cable TV users still have some rights

Are you frustrated by the high cost of cable television? If so, you are probably not alone.

Since April 1, 1999, the cable industry has been deregulated. Busically, that means that the Federal Communications Commission no longer has the authority to accept and review complaints about rates for cable channels. They do, however, continue to review appeals of local rate orders involving basic cable service.

So what does all of this mean to you? Although the FCC has stopped readving rate complaints, there are a few rights all cable consumers have in a deregulated cable marketplace. Here are some things to consider:

Consumers should expect a fair deal from their local cable company, with reasonable rates that reflect the costs of doing business.

company whenever rates for the programming service tier are raised due to the costs of obtaining programming.

E Consumers are entitled to write or call their cable company whenever they have complaints about their cable services. Consumers should expect a speedy response. Time Warner's phone number is (248) 553-7300.

Here is a another thing to remember: If your cable service is out, you are entitled to a refund for the time your service was off. However, you must call the cable company to alert them. Residents of Farmington, Farmington Hills and Novi also have the Southwestern Oakland

Cable Commission as a resource for their cable concerns. The FCC is still required to respond for their cable concerns. Inc. FCC is still required to respond to complaints about basic tier service and SWOCC will still submit those complaints. In addition, SWOCC can resolve complaints regarding customer service and outages that have been unresolved by the cable company. Our phone number is (248) 473-7256.


The cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills offers musical entertainment throughout the summer:
