### Garden Club offers tree care tips for summertime

The Hill and Dale Garden
Club of Farnington offers tips
for taking care of trees.
When summer dry spelle hit,
healthy mature trees are generally the lost plants in the landscape to show signs of drought
stress. Homeowners will respond
to wilting flowers, drooping vegtable crops and a sun baked
lawn and may overlook trees
which also need water.
Trees generally need about an
inch of water per week. Factors
that affect the need for irrigation
include soil type and tree condi-

sitting in a container of water and the roots die.

The only tools required for watering frees are lawn aprinklers and garden hoses. Two inches of water applied every two weeks during dry weather should wet the soil well down into the trees root zone. To make watering more efficient apply several inches of mulch around the base of your tree.

Piling the material higher around the outer edges and lower in the center will make a basin to catch water so that it

soaks into soil where the plant can use it. Mulch discourages weed growth. To prevent weeds and grass from coming up through mulch, don't put down a sheet of black plastic first. The plastic will keep air and water from moving in and out of the soil, and plant roots need both to function. Fabric weed barriers are better because they allow air and water to flow.

Keep mulch away from the tree trunk or main stems. This will prevent canker disease and rodent injury.




