Falcons chalk up another win, 3-0

Farmington earned its seventh victory in boys soccer Wednesday when it defeated host Walled Lake Central, 3-0.

Jon Kambouris scored the first two goals, giving the Falcons a 1-0 halftime lead. Justin Gortawski, a defender who had a chance to go on the attack, scored the third goal.

Farmington's leading scorer is Nick Ramirez, who has six goals.

"As far as passing and possessing the ball, it was probably the best game we played all year," Farmington coach Luke Juncal said. "We really controlled the field very well."

CANTON 3, N. FARMINGTON 1: It was, as Plymouth Canton coach Don Smith described it, "a good team game." And the result reflected it.

We attacked with a lot of numbers. (Stephen) Wayne and Gortawski, from the defense, were getting into the midfield and attacking. We had numbers in the box and created a lot of scoring chances."

Mike Zemanek scored an unassisted goal to put the Chiefs on top. Nick Houdek and John Kaczmarek built on the Canton lead, with Jonathan Johnson assisting on Houdek's goal and Ugo Okunribunye assisting on Kaczmarek's.

Farmington also had a goal called back. The official ruled Wayne had lifted his foot off the ground on a throw-in that resulted in a goal by Adam Lidgely.

The Raiders averted the shutout by getting a penalty kick goal from Brian Hor.

Midway through the first half, the Falcons passed up the left side to Jeff Froderick, who crossed the ball on the ground to Kambouris in front. Kambouris stayed on the ground to put the shot in the left side of the net.

"North Farmington is a nice club," Smith said. "They worked hard; they were scrappy. I thought we looked a little tired after that Northville game."

Kambouris scored again early in the second half when his corner kick angled into the goal.

Stevenson led 3-0 at Intermission. Joe Zawacki and Brian Campbell split time in goal for the Spartans.

In the 50th minute, the Vikings cleared the ball from their box to the 18 where Gortawski gained possession, dribbled around one defender and fired a shot into the upper left corner.

SALEM 3, CHURCHILL 0: State-ranked Plymouth Salem put this WLA soccer match away with a pair of goals in the final five minutes to post a win over a stubborn Livonia Churchill side Wednesday at Salem.

The Falcons had 24 shots at the Central goal, while Farmington goalie Matt Gasparotto had to make only two saves.

The Rocks, ranked sixth in the state, improved to 9-1-3 overall. Churchill, which has faced five of the state's top 10 ranked teams in the state, is 2-7.

"We totally controlled the game," Juncal said. "Ninety-five percent of the time we had possession of the ball. Central didn't get into our defensive half much at all."

Brian Poppeny scored in the first half for the Rocks. Sean Lowe and Jeff Haar added goals late in the second half.

The victory was not without cost for the Falcons, who lost their second-leading scorer, Andrew Buck, with an injury.

That was one of the great saves I've seen in high school soccer," said Churchill coach Reid Friedrichs, a former all-state keeper at Ann Arbor Pioneer who later earned All-Big Ten honors at Michigan State. "That was a moment-timer. We played a pretty good first half, but our defense relaxed for two minutes and that was the difference. You can't relax versus the sixth-ranked team in the state."

Young roller skater will compete in world event

Lindsay Mann, 13, will represent the United States next month at the World Artistic Roller Skating Championships in Brisbane, Australia.

She earned a place on the U.S. team in August when she placed second in Junior World Class Ladies Singles at the U.S. Roller Skating National Championships in Syracuse, N.Y.

Mann, an eighth grader at South Lyon Middle School, is one of 25 skaters on the U.S. team and one of its youngest members.

She has placed in every local and national competition this year, including a first-place finish in Junior World Class Singles in June at the regional event in Chicago. She also was fourth in Freshman Singles at the U.S. Championships in Syracuse, Calif.

Since roller skating is not yet an Olympic sport, the governing organization is the Federation Internationale Roller Skating, which is responsible for the World Championships each year. The event will take place next year in Boston, Mass.

When Jellise moved to Florida, Mann worked with two other coaches. She went to nationals every year but never placed.

Then, under the direction of Cynthia Gates at Great Skate in Roseville and Darlene Waters at Barborton, Ohio, she earned her first national placement in Elementary Figures last year in Fresno, Calif.

She was a regular at the rink within a year and enrolled in classes to learn the basics of proper roller skating from Donna Wright, the rink pro.

CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCE SUMMARY C-655-99

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 31, TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES SECTIONS 31-303 AND 31-303.7 OF THE CITY CODE, CONCERNING OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE UNDER INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND REFUSING TO TAKE A CHEMICAL TEST TO CONFORM THE PROVISIONS TO STATE LAW AND INCREASE THE PENALTIES THEREOF.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

Section 1.  
Sec. 31-303, Chapter 31, Traffic and Motor Vehicles of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:  
Sec. 31-303 OPERATING UNDER INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, OPERATING WHILE VIBRILY IMPAIRED, ALCOHOL CONTENT OF MINOR, ATTEMPTING, PENALTIES, INCLUDING CHANGING THE PENALTIES FROM 90 TO 93 DAYS, MAXIMUM JAIL TERM.
