COCAINE ARREST

In Farmington Hills: Police arrested a Farmington Hills man, 36, after finding 3.8 grams of marijuana in his possession Oct. 1. Police questioned the man who was in a taxi with a woman outside the Travelodge Motel on Haggerty Road, north of Eight Mile. Police asked him to get out of the cab for a consent search and later found a plastic bag with crack cocaine in the grass where he was standing.

VANDERBILT

In Farmington Hills:
Someone slashed two tires on a 1999 Ford parked at Extended Stay on Stansbury and 12 Mile between Sept. 30-Oct. 1, causing \$250 damage.

Someone smashed the windshield of a Farmington Hills police patrol car parked at Metro Bank on Grand River and Halsted Sept. 30-Oct. 1 causing \$350 damage.

AREALLY

In Farmington Hills:
