### POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire reports made during the past week in Farmington and Farmington Hills.

**MARIJUANA ARREST**  
**In Farmington Hills:** Police arrested a Dearborn man, 27, after finding 2.2 grams of marijuana wrapped in plastic in the 1988 Mercury Cougar during a traffic stop on Eight Mile and Grand River around 6:20 p.m. Oct. 26. Authorities stopped the car for not having a license plate.

**MOTORCYCLE STOLEN**  
**In Farmington Hills:** A 1999 red Suzuki motorcycle was reported stolen from outside Independence Green Apartments on Roosevelt Court the night of Oct. 26-26.

**ASSAULT**  
**In Farmington Hills:** Two motorists reported that they were assaulted by three males at the corner of Valley Forge and Lake Park around 9:30 p.m. Oct. 26. One victim told police three men got out of a 1991 Lincoln in front of his vehicle and accused him of using his high beam lights on them. When the victim drove around the corner to talk to a male in another car about what happened, the three men turned up and choked and head-butted one man and slapped the other, police reports said.

**DRUNKEN DRIVING**  
**In Farmington Hills:** Police arrested a Southfield man, 48, for drunken driving on southbound Orchard Lake and Oakland at 10:40 p.m. Oct. 27. Authorities stopped the 1996 Lincoln for weaving on I-696. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .11 percent. The legal limit is .10 percent.

**Police arrested a Northville man, 30, for drunken driving on Eight Mile, near Whitlock, shortly after midnight Oct. 26. Police stopped the 1999 Pontiac for traveling 85 miles an hour in a 45-mph zone. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .16 percent.**

**SLEEPY SUSPECT**  
**In Farmington Hills:** A Southfield man, 19, who is wanted in Troy on a larceny warrant, refused to stop for Hills police after he pulled into a driveway on North Brandon around 3:15 p.m. Oct. 26. The man got out of the car, pulled the gate shut and ran through the backyard, sluding the officer. The same man managed to get away from police when stopped two weeks ago, police reports said.

**EMBEZZLEMENT**  
**In Farmington Hills:** A former employee at ABC Warehouse on Orchard Lake and 13 Mile is believed to have used fraudulent returns to credit his charge card with \$1,235 between Sept. 6-Oct. 26. The worker, who has been fired, admitted the incident to store management and has offered to pay back the money.

**AUTO THEFT**  
**In Farmington Hills:** A 1988 Chevrolet Monte Carlo was reported stolen from Golfpointe in Copper Creek Golf Course Oct. 27.

Ellis changed his last name after a fallout with his father, Hicks said.

Police found Ellis' badly decomposed body in his Independence Green apartment May 2, 1998. He had been stabbed 46 times, medical examiner reports said.

Authorities arrested Summerville in Minneapolis, where he was driving Ellis' Jeep Cherokee.

A bloody shirt with Summerville's embroidered name was found at the murder scene along with two broken knives.

Summerville's attorney said his client was depressed after being diagnosed with HIV in April 1997, and pushed for a lesser charge of manslaughter or second-degree murder.

Ellis and Summerville had a two-year relationship that had broken off. They still kept in contact, according to court testimony.

The victim's mother, Alfreda Hicks, died six weeks after her son's murder. Ellis' brother blamed grief.

"I strongly believe it was (grief) because it was her heart that gave out," Keith Hicks said.

"Mikhail was her favorite son. I felt he (Summerville) really took two lives."

Summerville's sentencing brings some closure, but Hicks said he cannot reconcile the brutal way his brother was murdered.

"He wasn't a person who would go out and be mean to people," Hicks said. "He ran away from violence and he ran away from trouble."

"That's why he moved away out to Farmington Hills, away from the violence and away from the trouble."
