■ Ticket prices will be 25 cents for adults and 10 cents for those 12 years old and under, for both Friday and Sunday screenings. Movies will be contemporary titles, and will be shown at usual times.

■ An auction of classic theater memorabilia is set for 11 a.m. Saturday for the first 288 people who arrive. Admission into the auction is free.

■ The biggest highlight of the weekend is the Saturday, Jan. 8, Civic gala. Tickets (priced at \$60 each) must be purchased in person at the offices of Farmington City Manager Frank Lauhoff, 23800 Liberty Street. They are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and must be paid for by check or cash. There only will be available seating for 288 patrons.

■ The gala will also include a "vintage" movie, the unveiling of the Civic Theatre mural - which is currently being created in the lobby - cocktails and hors d'oeuvres at Legato (next to the Civic) and valet parking.

Also spurring enthusiasm is the auction of items, proceeds from which will help the Civic with continuing renovations.

Children board fantasy flight to North Pole

The Flight to the North Pole departed from the International terminal of Metropolitan Airport on Dec. 9, with 60 tiny patients who paid a visit to Santa.

The children from various hospitals got a chance to board a real plane to the "North Pole." After boarding and an imaginary take-off, the children were given lunch, presents and then visited with Santa.

The children, ages 3 to 6, are undergoing cancer treatments

at DMC Children's Hospital of Michigan, Beaumont Hospital, St. John's Hospital and Ann Arbor Mott Children's Hospital.

This annual fantasy flight is presented by the Silverliners, an alumni association of former Eastern Airlines Flight Attendants. North Pole "flights" are taking place in 18 other cities around the U.S. and Mexico.

"This project is a great way to give to children who have seen a lot of pain in their lives," said Margo Salyer, Silverliners

spokesperson and chairman of Flight to the North Pole.

Dearborn's Adray Appliance and Hudson's Fairlane employees have been donating the toys ever since the project began 12 years ago. Chevrolet will keep the children warm at the "North Pole" by providing beautiful Santa Bear sweatshirts for each child.
