There are still plenty of chances for making money in public utility enterprises. The wave of municipal ownership sentiment that passed over the country several years ago did not accomplish a great deal in changing plants from private companies to public utilities. This is shown by the government statisfichams. A recent report showed that 92 per cent of the electric light and power business in the United States was in the hands of private companies and only 8 per cent in municipal plants.
