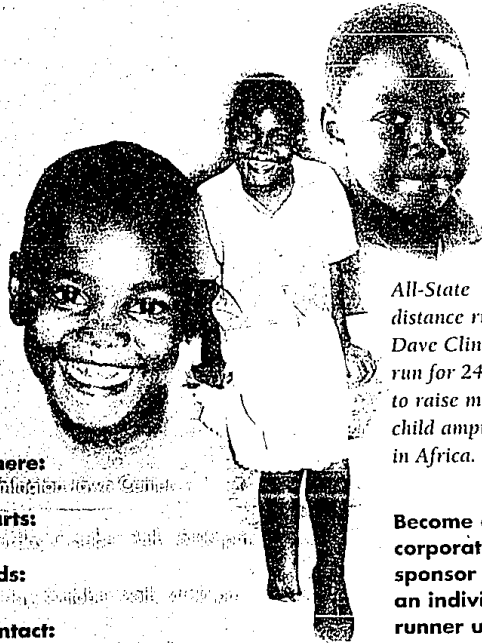

POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following items are police and fire incidents reported in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:

A reciprocating saw, hand saw, hammer drill and two drill motors were stolen from a construction site on 12 Mile and Haggerty roads Oct. 11.

Someone stole a pair of CCM hockey skates, CD player and a hockey jacket from a 1997 Chevrolet S-10 truck parked on Halsted Oct. 7.

A 1996 Huffy 15-speed bike was stolen from a Power Road residence between Oct. 6-8.

Someone stole a saw, rip saw, arc welder and a tool pouch from a garage on Trevelyan Street between Oct. 1-9. The garage door was unlocked, police reports said.

BREAK INS

In Farmington Hills:

A thief broke a car window and stole a purse from a 1992 Dodge Caravan parked on Muirland and Dand Oct. 9.

Someone stole a stereo and cellular phone after breaking a window on a 1998 Jeep Cherokee parked on Nottingham the night of Oct. 11-12.

BURGLARY

In Farmington Hills:

In Farmington Hills:

Someone stole a white 1994 Dodge Ram from a Colgate Street residence between Oct. 6-7.

SHOPLIFTING

In Farmington Hills:

A woman walked into Ladies Day Golf on 12 Mile and walked out with 10-12 golf jackets around 2 p.m. Oct. 10. A store employee tried to stop the woman who ran into an older model car and sped off. Southfield police tried to stop a 1987 beige Oldsmobile, which was

reported stolen out of Riverview. The car matched a plate number involved in the theft. After a chase, Southfield police lost sight of the car on Eight Mile and Wyoming.

PARTY BUSTED

In Farmington Hills:

Police ticketed two Redford teens, ages 18 and 17, for being minors in possession of alcohol after breaking up a party at the Motel 6 in Farmington Hills around 1:50 a.m. Oct. 11. Another Redford teen was ticketed under the city's open house party violation. Police found several empty beer cans in the room which was occupied by nine teens.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

In Farmington Hills:

Police arrested a Rochester Hills man, 29, for drunken driving on Grand River and Tuck around 4 a.m. Oct. 11. Police stopped the 1986 Acura for speeding. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .12 percent. It is illegal to drive with a level of .10 percent.

ASSAULT

In Farmington Hills:

A Detroit woman, 19, fled from her ex-boyfriend's truck and ran to a home in the 13 Mile and Haggerty area seeking help around 2 a.m. Oct. 2. The man punched her in the face several times and threatened to kill her after he forced her into his truck at a Detroit nightclub, according to the police report. Novi police saw the woman flee from the truck and tried to question the driver, who refused to state what had happened. Police arrested the man, a 33-year-old Farmington Hills resident, for domestic assault. He was also ticketed for interfering a police officer after he refused to give booking information.

PURSE STOLEN

In Farmington Hills:

A Farmington Hills woman had her wallet stolen after another shopper asked the victim to read the label on two items because she had forgotten her glasses Oct. 2. The incident took place at Kroger on 12 Mile and Halsted. The victim realized her wallet was stolen when she went to the checkout area. When she phoned her credit card company, she was told someone tried to make a \$3,000 cash advance.

WEAPONS FOUND

In Farmington Hills:

Police are seeking an arrest warrant for a 17-year-old after finding two hammers, a folding knife and a sawed-off golf club in a 1991 Eagle Summit parked on Old Timber and High Valley Oct. 2. Officers were called to the area on a report of teens fighting. When police arrived, a group of kids scattered. Two teens, though, said they were "paged" to the area and that they were told a fight was going to happen on Forestbrook. The 17-year-old admitted to police had a knife "for defense" in his vehicle. A subsequent search turned up the knife and other items.

BUSINESS BURGLARY

The victim told police he changed the code on his garage door so that someone couldn't gain access to the garage. The stolen garage door opener was valued at about \$10.
