The Redford Suburban League has distributed over \$360,000 throughout the years to people of all ages who are physically challenged. President Cynthia

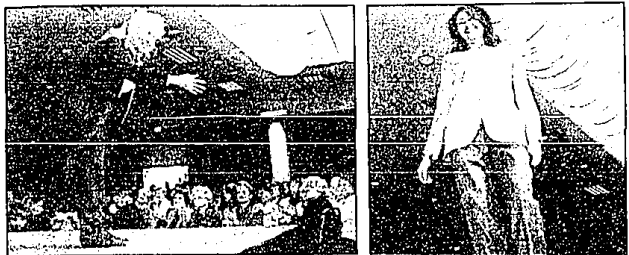
Jamieson thanked the guests and celebrities for their attendance, patronage of the craft boutiques and purchase of raffle tickets.

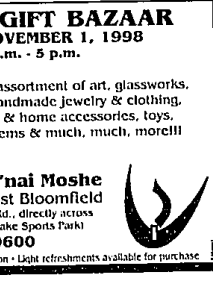
**PURCHASE POWER**
