"I like talking with all the drum majors like Plymouth-Canton, Jenison and Lake Park, said senior color guard member Yoko Minowa. "They'er really nice people."


"I love it," said Megan Fay, also a senior in color guard. Tils great meeting all the people here from the number one bands. I think this is an amazing experience for kids."




