### To Prevent Drafts.

A simple and practical way to prevent drafts entering under a door that has, through shrinkage, a wide crack under it, is to fold three tilchnesses of paper together just the width of the door and two inches deep and cover it with serge or cloth as near the color of the door as possible. Sew to this three small brass riggs, one a quarter of an inch from each end and one in the middle. Fasten into the bottom of the door three small screw-hooks and hang the rings to them. You will have a perfect protection from cold air coming under the door and one that is easily removed and kept dusted.
