Wojciech also spoke about how he was "getting along much better" with his dad in recent months. On the dining room table was Wojciech's acoustic guitar, which his father had helped fix. "He had incredible stamina and willpower for life and work." Wojciech said, glancing toward the guitar. "I guess I'm glad he's at pence now."

Detroit police afficers, as of lute Friday, were still trying to determine why the guman walked into Olbrot's classroom, shot him - re-londed - and shot him again. Olbrot, who had gunshot wounds to his head and chest, was taken to Detroit Receiving Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

"He was an excellent sportsman," Henryka said.




