Newswoman takes profession to task

■ Speaking at Adat Shalom in Farmington Hills, NBC political reporter Andrea Mitchell said there needs to be more accountability in the news media.

Newt Gingrich changed that when he
challenged Bob Michael. At the same
time, all the old rules went out the
window. In 1994, a lot of new congressmen were elected who had not traveled
abroad. It's gotten a lot meaner. It's
dysfunctional and it has to change."

process on the next presidential election, Mitchell said 'it is undetermined.
