Service aim — end to violence

The World Sabbath of Religious Reconciliation will be at 7 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 22, at Christ Church Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills.

The interfaith holy day demands an end to violence done in the name of God, and calls for greater respect between the world's religions and ethnic groups, and praying for healing of past atrocities.

The Sabbath is the idea of two Episcopal priests from the Diocese of Michigan, the Rev. Edward L. Mullins, Rector at Christ Church Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills, and the Rev. Rod Reinhart, interim rector at Trinity Church, Farmington Hills.

Reinhart said the day's goal are: to create the first holy day to be shared by all religions of the world, to teach religious leaders how to publicly oppose hate campaigns and religious wars, and to promote the service as a model for people around the world to incorporate their own religious life as a way to call for justice, peace and understanding among the world religions.

The Rev. Kenneth James Flowers of Greater New Mt. Moriah Baptist Church in Detroit, an internationally known African-American preacher involved in the campaign to create justice and peace, is keynote speaker.

People who have been victims of religious persecution in the Sudan, Ethiopia, Nazi Germany and Kosovo will share their experiences. Also invited are poets and musicians, who will take part in fellowship after the service.

In early December, Reinhart and Mullins were interviewed extensively for South African television where they attended The Parliament of World Religions.
