

# Falcons, Raiders in 3-way tie

Farmington escaped with a 40-37 victory Friday at Walled Lake Central and retained a share of the Western Lakes Activities Association lead in boys basketball.

The Falcons share first place with North Farmington and Livonia Churchill. All three teams are 9-3.

Nobody scored in double figures for Farmington (8-1), but it had balanced scoring from four players.

Junior Chad Seaborn led the way with nine points. Senior C.J. Whitfield scored eight, senior Justin Milus and Junior Matt Mikel seven apiece. Milus also had six rebounds.

Guards Paul Pavelich and Steve Horn scored 12 and 11 points, respectively, for the Vikings, who are 1-1 in the WLA and 2-6 overall.

The Falcons, who made eight of 16 free throws, led 22-19 at halftime.

N. FARMINGTON 67, STEVENSON 32: It was a sound game plan: it just didn't work. The Spartans went into a Friday game with the visiting Raiders hoping to sink North Farmington's zone defense with a barrage of three-point baskets.

Guards Phil Watna and Brian Shulman sank Livonia Stevenson with their own outside shooting attack as North made seven three-pointers. Watna scored 21 points and Shulman hit 10.

Holden Beverly, who had 10 points, was the only Spartan to reach double figures.

North Farmington (5-4) improved to 3-0 in the Western Lakes Activities Association. Stevenson (2-7) is winless in three league contests.

Cautious play limited North to a 9-7 lead after one period. But a 10-6 second period opened the game, and a 14-8 third quarter in favor of the Raiders decided the outcome.

CLARENCEVILLE 64, LIGGETT 39: The Trojans now have a five-game winning streak — and few at the school remember when a Livonia Clarenceville boys basketball team had a longer one.

**CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCE SUMMARY C-663-2000**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 35, ZONING, OF THE CITY CODE TO REQUIRE BUILDINGS IN THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT TO HAVE NO FRONT YARD SETBACK, EXCEPT IN CERTAIN SPECIFIC INSTANCES**

Section 1.  
Section 35-162(i), only, of Chapter 35, Zoning, of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

(i) area, Height, Bulk, and Placement in the Central Business District. Provides that the Planning Commission shall establish the area height, bulk, and placement for principal and accessory building in the Central Business District.

**CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCE SUMMARY C-664-2000**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 35 ZONING, TO ADD REGULATIONS REGARDING OUTDOOR LIGHTING THROUGHOUT THE CITY.**

Section 1.  
Section 35-105, Light, of Chapter 35 Zoning, of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 35-105 Outdoor Lighting  
(b) Outdoor lighting in all use districts shall be directed toward and confined to ground areas. Lighting in nonresidential districts used for the external illumination of buildings so as to feature such buildings shall be placed and shielded so as not to interfere with the vision of persons on adjacent highways or on adjacent property.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 35, ZONING, TO REQUIRE SPACE FOR LOCATION OF DUMPSTER IN NONRESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS AND TO REGULATE DUMPSTERS.**

Section 1.  
Section 35-225, Dumpsters is hereby added to Chapter 35, Zoning, of the City Code, which section shall read as follows:

Section 35-225 Dumpsters  
Provides that each site plan for lots in nonresidential districts, presented to the Planning Commission, shall include screened dumpster locations and subject to approval of the Planning Commission.

Section 16.25.6 Dumpsters Provided Upon Public Parking Lots.  
Requires commercial properties adjacent to public parking lots to use dumpster locations as may be provided and located in the public parking lot area.
