forfeited his match with John Pocock at 145 after suffering a puncture wound on the top of the head.

"They had a pretty good match going," Boyar said, guessing the injury was caused, inadvertently, by one of Pocock's teeth. "Not that it was intentional or anything. It must have hit a blood vein."

Consequently, Farmington used all of the five minutes allotted for what is called blood time and held the forfeit the bout.

"He had to abort to finish the match and James [not been pinned], we would've won the match," Boyar said, adding even a technical fall (five points) would have left the Chiefs one point short in the final tally.

Obviously, in such a close match, each team can point to several what-if situations, Boyar added.

Farmington had a chance at 152, also. Ostach was ahead of Canton's Scott McKee, 7-1, and needed one more point for a major decision that would've given the Falcons four teams points instead of three.

"He needed a takedown for a major decision and wasn't able to get it," Boyar said. "He went for it, slipped and the score ended up being 9-4."

"There are several places you could look back and say we could have won that match."

The same was true for Canton.

"They had a chance to win it at 140 when Chris Hoeby was going

against Aaron Turk," Boyar said. "The score was 8-1, and they needed one more takedown themselves. I'm sure they're looking back at that score, too."

Boyar elected to void the 189 weight class rather than put an inexperienced and underweight wrestler on the mat against Canton's Phil Rothwell, who was the runner-up in the Observerland Tournament.

"We would've been giving up 20 pounds, and that's asking a lot of a freshman, not to get pinned by an experienced wrestler," Boyar said. "There's no use risking a young wrestler like that."

Farmington's wrestler, the only other option at that point, weighed in at 162.1 pounds and barely qualified for the 171 division; whereas, Rothwell registered 182.9 pounds.

The Falcons lost to the Chiefs in a double dual at Monroe in December, 41-33.

Farmington didn't have 119-pound Jon Simonsen for that match. He was recovering from mono and didn't have clearance from his doctor to compete. Simonsen won by decision Thursday.

The other turnarounds came from Tom Mahon (140) and Kyle Domagalski (215).
