Oak Park, which defeated Redford Union in the other semifinal, 51-15, voided the first two weights but wrestled well, otherwise. Farmington won five decisions and had pins from James Claraham, Mike Murtland and Kyle Domagalski.

Murtland and Domagalski were the only Falcons to win both matches by pin. Domagalski has a 20-7 record and has won 18 bouts by pin.

In the final, Farmington led 22-9 following early-round decisions by Jon Simmons, Aaron Turk and Tom Mahon. Mark Ostach and Ben Lukas also won on points.

"All of the matches were hard-fought matches; (the knights) were a real physical team," Beyer said, adding his wrestlers were at the top of their game for post-season competition.

"(The Falcons) were right there where they wanted to be. Coach (Barry) Walsh talked to them and let them know what they had to do to win the thing."

"It's nice to come out of the first six weight classes being in the lead."

Ostach won a 3-2 decision over Jason Malone, who finished ahead of Ostach in the Oakland County tournament. Even Joe Kremer, despite losing a 9-2 decision, helped the team, Beyer added.

"He was down 9-1 and needed to get one point to take away the major decision they had going," he said. "Everybody all the way through the whole round did their part."

Wrestling on the same day as the weigh-in was a new experience for the Falcons. That's especially so for Lukas, who recently dropped to the 171 weight class.

During the regular season, Farmington conducts weigh-ins at school Wednesday for Thursday duals and Friday for Saturday tournaments.

"When it comes to the end of the year, we weigh in shoulder-to-shoulder (the same day)," Beyer said. "It's tougher. It wouldn't be so bad if they were used to it."

"We're one of the few states in the union that still does home weigh-ins. In fact, our league is talking about going back to shoulder-to-shoulder, because it would be a little easier for the kids."

"It changes their whole routine around, and kids' bodies don't adjust that quickly to the change because they haven't done it all season."

In the Thurston bout, Farmington had pins from Simmons, Turk, Mahon, Ostach, Murtland, Lukas, Domagalski and Brian Brinaden. Bryan Proven won a decision, and the Falcons received 18 points on voids.

Simmons can boast of having a 32-9 record, Ostach 30-9, Murtland 28-10, Lukas 27-10 and

Brinaden 28-9. Turk (17-14), Joe Pappay (11-7), Mahon (22-17) and Claraham (14-10) also are on the plus side of 500.
