

Hawks need help; Falcons share title

Farmington Harrison suffered a setback Friday when host Livonia Franklin scored a 63-61 upset win in boys basketball.

But the Hawks could still make the Western Lakes Activities Association playoffs, which start this week.

Harrison needs some help from Plymouth Salem, however. In a game postponed to Monday, the Rocks play host to Walled Lake Central in the WLAAs regular-season finale.

A Salem victory will give Harrison the eighth and final playoff berth. A Central victory will eliminate Harrison and put Central in the tournament.

Northville, Harrison and Central went into the final weekend of round-robin play tied for seventh place with 4-6 records.

Northville defeated Livonia Churchill and is in at 5-6. Harrison drops to 4-7 but would win a tiebreaker with Central if the Vikings also lose, because the Hawks beat Central in head-to-head competition.

Franklin's Joe Ruggiero scored a game-high 25 points that

included six of the team's 10 three-point field goals.

The Patriots had two throes from Derek Schems, who also led Franklin with 10 rebounds, and one apiece from Chris Peterson and Jason Micallef.

Mike Copeland added nine points and seven rebounds for the Patriots, who are 3-8 in the WLAAs and 5-12 overall.

"Harrison played well. (Coach) Dave (Turnquist) did a nice job of switching up defenses and instead of some confusion," Franklin coach Dan Robinson said.

"To our credit, our kids played very well and hung in there. Joe played well and we did a good job of setting screens and getting him open. It was a good team win for us."

Joe Hundley led the Hawks with 20 points and nine rebounds. Brian Nelson added 12 points.

Harrison (8-9) led after one

quarter, 17-13, and at halftime, 26-24. Franklin took a 42-41 lead into the final period.

Harrison sank seven of 14 free throws, Franklin nine of 17.

Falcons gain title share

Farmington is guaranteed a share of the Lakes Division championship and no less than the No. 3 seed in the WLAAs tournament after defeating Livonia Stevenson Friday, 69-50.

"Not we can sit back, let the others fight it out and see who we play (in the tournament)," Farmington coach Denny Mikol said.

"We knew a win tonight would guarantee us a share of the division championship. The kids were focused in on that."

"One of our goals was to be a division champion, so at least we're going to get a piece of that."

The Falcons finish 9-2 in the WLAAs regular season and 4-1 in the Lakes Division.

Pending the outcome of games that were postponed Friday, Farmington could still tie for the WLAAs round-robin title.

It trails co-leaders North Farmington and Walled Lake Western by one game. Those teams are 9-1 with one game remaining.

The Falcons expanded a 22-16, first-quarter lead over the Spartans to 40-24 at halftime and 56-38 by the end of three quarters.

Chad Seaborn scored a game-high 19 points to lead Farmington (14-3). Justin Milus and Brian Davies had nine points apiece, as well as 13 and nine rebounds, respectively. Matt Mikol and Curtis Tillman added eight points each.

Chris Severson was high scorer for Stevenson (3-14) with 12 points. John Rehberg scored eight, Harland Beverly seven.

AQUINAS 50, CLARENCEVILLE 49:

The Raiders jumped all over the Trojans in the first two quarters by doing them to shoot from outside.

Seavert Aquinas opened in a 2-3 zone Friday, and Clarenceville made it look good by making just two three-pointers out of 20 attempted from beyond the arc.

"It was 26-9 at half," coach Bill Oyer of the Trojans said. "That was the problem."

Senior forward Joe Burke was unstoppable for the Raiders (14-12) in the crossover game between the No. 2 Metro team and the last-place team in the Catholic League's AA Division.

Burke scored 31 points, 15 when the 6-foot-5 forward wasn't hitting, senior guard G. J. Melchior with 15. Junior center Scott Wren led the Trojans with 20, while senior forward Rick Durack scored 15.


Aquinas gave up its zone in the second half and Clarenceville almost ran itself back into the game. The Trojans closed to within six points late in the fourth quarter but could not clear it.

On Tuesday, Clarenceville (11-8) is the No. 2 seed in the Metro Conference tournament and hosts No. 7 Cranbrook in a quarterfinal matchup.

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter contained.

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show RA-1A, Single-Family Residential District classification where RA-1, Single-Family Residential District classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

Sidewalk #23-23-451-002 thru 011; 23-29-452-001 thru 003; 23-29-463-001 thru 007, 009 thru 025; 23-29-427-005 thru 012, 014, 016, 017, 018, 023 thru 029; 23-29-476-001 thru 010, 013 thru 028, 031 thru 034.

A part of the East 1/4 of Section 29, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan. The area to be rezoned includes Heather Hills, Heather Hills No. 1 and 2 Subdivisions and adjacent property located on the northwest corner of Nine Mile and Drake Roads.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 14th day of February, 2000, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
