### Farmington gymnast is WLAA runner-up

Brighton's Jenn Dion for first place on vault, each with a 9.16 score.

She was second on bars and finished just .05 behind Matte. Keesling also was fourth on floor exercise and sixth on balance beam. She scored 9.3 on all three events.

"This was my best meet so far," Keesling said. "I broke 37 for the first time; that was my goal."

Keesling said vault was her best-executed event; she had better beam performance, and her score on bars was something of a surprise to her.

"That was unexpected," she said. "Bars is not usually my strong event. Floor is easier for me, and floor is fun. Everyone in the crowd gets into it."

But Farmington was less than a point behind Canton, a team it might otherwise have outperformed. 135.75-134.80.

Keesling tied with Matte and won every event in Division I, had a better performance. Matte's all-around total was 37.65.

Keesling's individual effort alone wasn't enough for fifth-place Farmington, however. The team needed more help from others if it was to move ahead of Plymouth Canton.

Defending champion Hartland and Brighton finished one-two as expected, and Northville-Novis was third. All three teams score better than 142 points.
