## LARCENY IN A BUILDING

**In Farmington:**  
A 17-year-old Farmington Hills woman told police her \$1,050 diamond necklace was stolen at Aloha Tanning between 3-4 p.m. Thursday.

According to police reports, the woman took off the necklace and placed it beside the tanning bed.

After her tan, she left the area and returned shortly thereafter only to find the necklace missing.

It was described as a white gold lady's necklace, with a 16-inch art deco link chain and five round cut natural diamonds.

## TEENAGERS WITH CIGARETTES

**In Farmington:**  
Police ticketed three 16-year-old girls for being in possession of tobacco, about 11:30 a.m. Monday.

An officer on westbound Grand River at Farmington noticed several paper air fresheners hanging from the rear view window and that three teenagers appeared to be smoking cigarettes.

After stopping the driver for vision obstruction, due to the air fresheners, the

tickets were issued for minors being in possession of tobacco.

The cigarettes were confiscated. Two of the girls are from Farmington Hills and the third from Northville.

A 17-year-old Detroit man also received a ticket for being a minor in possession of tobacco, after a patrol officer noticed someone smoking in the alley behind Farmer Jack, 24128 Farmington Road, at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Two Farmington High School students were suspended following a fist fight, taking place about 8:30 a.m. Monday, Feb. 28, in a school restroom.

A 16-year-old Farmington Hills boy allegedly punched a 16-year-old boy, also from Farmington Hills, resulting in a bruised eye.

The fight, FHS Principal John Barrett told police, actually began on Feb. 28 at a Farmington restaurant.

At Ram's Horn on Grand River, the 16-year-old opened a cut in the other teen's face with a punch.

Two days later, at the high school, the original perpetrator allegedly taunted his victim. The fight in the restroom followed, police reports indicated.

Parents were notified, and no charges were filed.

Barrett said both students are due to return to school Monday.
