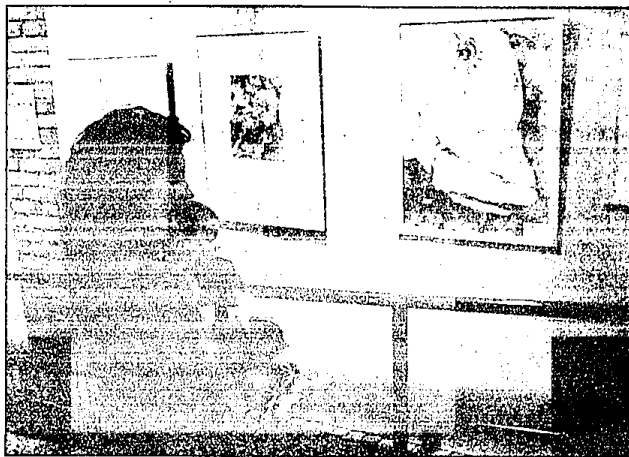

Mask benefit is Saturday

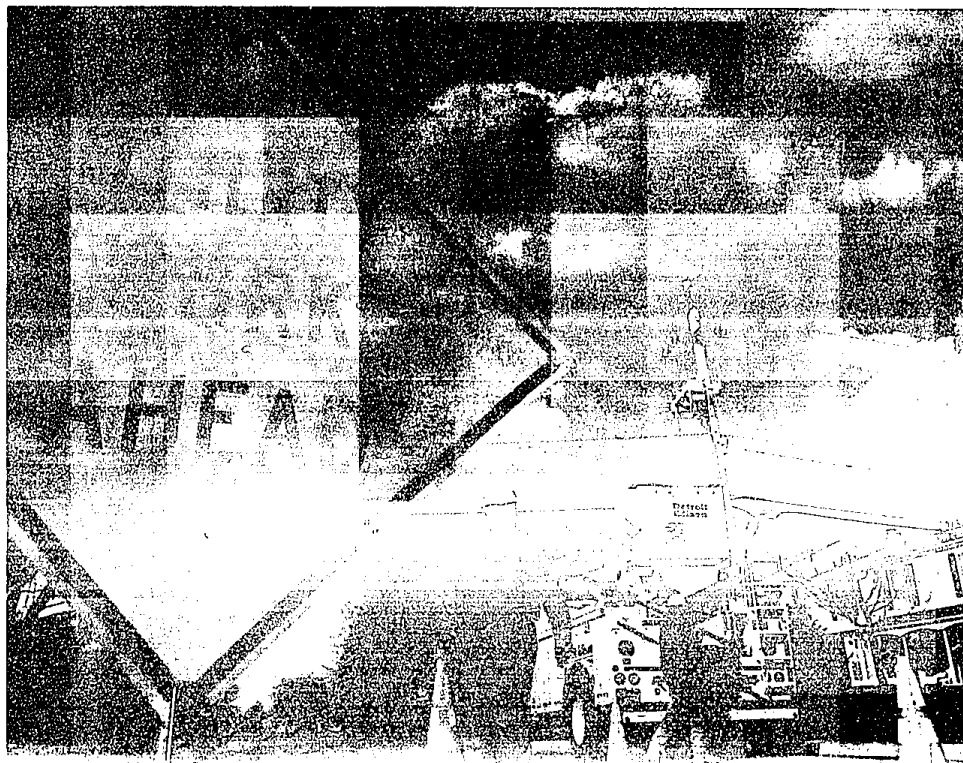
