

Marlins blitz Blazers in Catholic League victory

Farmington Hills Mercy improved its Catholic League record to 4-1 in girls soccer Thursday with its second victory in many days.

Carrie Kluska scored two goals to lead her team to a 7-0 rout of Livonia Ladywood. Susie Royle, Carrie Denton, Sumbal Ahmad, Sarah Moore and Justice Hughes chipped in one goal apiece. The Marlins led 4-0 at halftime.

Mercy netminder Kristin Pimlott made six saves while earning her first shutout of the season.

"The defense was looking pretty good today," coach Tania Maclebo said. "We were bringing people off the bench, and the level of the game stayed the same. We were consistent."

The Marlins (5-2) defeated visiting Birmingham Marian on Wednesday, 4-3. The game was postponed from Tuesday due to the weather.

Angie Trudeau scored two goals, Roble and Marie Lentz one each. Lentz scored on a

penalty kick; Roble and Trudeau had one assist apiece.

Marian scored the first goal early, but Mercy answered with two in a row by Trudeau. The Marlins led 3-1 at the half and 4-1 before the Mustangs scored a pair of late goals.

"Marian has quite a bit of speed, and they're pretty quick," Maclebo said. "We did well marking them."

Along with Bishop Foley, they have a little more speed than we're used to seeing, and we did well with that."

Pimlott made 20 saves in the Marian game. Kluska is Mercy's leading scorer with eight goals for the season.

Harrison's Emily Jackson scored a goal on a direct kick, and Lauren Libowitz also figured in the scoring with a goal. Jackson had two assists and Amber Nolis one.

"Emily played both ends of the field very well," Harrison coach Greg Strickland said. "Her leadership on the field really came through."

"Lauren had a good game at stopper and made a good run on a through ball by Amber to score."

Harrison goalie Moira Morel was shaken up and had to leave the game, but she returned to shut down the Warriors in the last 10 minutes. Alex Cleri did a good job nailing in for her, coach Strickland said.

SALEM 3, FARMINGTON 0: Considering who the opponent was, the Falcons felt pretty good about the way they played despite the loss, according to Farmington coach Steve Montgomery.

The Rocks are one of the perennial powers in the WLLA and are currently ranked No. 4 in Division 1.

"Salem is one of the top teams in the state. We're not ranked at all, and we hung in there with them," Montgomery said.

Farmington held Salem scoreless for nearly the first 32 minutes. Katie Muttin gave the Rocks a 1-0 halftime lead when she scored with 8:14 left in the half.

Stevenson was the runner-up last year in the Division 1 state tournament and is ranked No. 2 this year.

"They vary handily merited us last year," North coach Tim Russell said. "We played an excellent game. The girls have such tremendous character, and it's making a huge difference for us."

Dana White, Nicole Katkos and Lindsay Gulick scored for the Spartans, and just a 3-0 halftime lead. Gulick also had two assists and White one.

North goalie Anna Muir made 22 of her 17 saves in the first half, "so the defense really buckled down" in the second half, Russell said. "Anna saved a couple hard shots without a rebound. She had just a terrific game."

The Raiders, who were 5-2 overall heading into a Saturday game with Berkley, played a great game and had some solid scoring opportunities themselves, he added.

"It was enough to play with this team and keep them out of our net but they generate some offense, too," Russell said. "We had some scoring chances where we almost put it in the net and didn't get a toe on it."

Lauren Hogan came nearest to scoring for the Raiders said.

"She did a tremendous job on the wing," Russell said. "She controlled the ball, made a lot of steals and challenged. She had a standout game."

But the play of the game, according to Russell, would have to be All Edwards, who moved from midfielder to sweeper for this game.

"She wouldn't let anything through," he said. "She was constantly taking the ball away from players and passing up to the wing. She ran the defense beautifully."

Jessie Tate and Lindsay Berbiglia, who switched from forward to midfielder, also made key contributions to the North team effort.

The Raiders are 0-1 in the WLLA Lakes Division and the Spartans 2-0.
