The Clarenceville School District has gone four-for-four during the recent North Contral Association of Colleges and Schools accreditation process.

The district's high school, middle school and two elementaries, Dotsford and Grandvlew, received the samp of approval for the 1998-2000 candemic year from the Midwestern accreditation association during its meeting in Chicago April 4.

NCA is a non-profit organization, accrediting more than 8,000 schools divided into seven categories, including elementary, middle and secondary. Those 8,000 schools are spread out over 19 states and also include the Department of Defense Dependent School overseas.

To become a member of NCA, a school must meet NCA's standards, conduct a self-study and adopt a model of continuous school inprovement (alse known as seeking an endorsement) that focuses on improving student performance.
