Bush was highly complimentary of Steinkopf.

"He was, without a doubt, one of the greatest men I ever knew, or will ever know," Bush said. "Just a heart of gold. They just don't come any better than Fred Steinkopf."

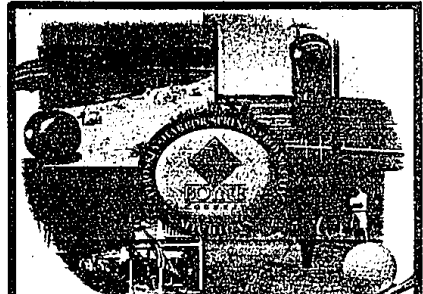
