Farmington boys are 3rd in relays

Farmington High finished third Tuesday at the Ambrose Eccentric Relays at Birmingham Sabhorn High School. Birmingham Brother Rice won the meet with 62 points. Coach Chip Bridges' Farmington team compiled 62 points.

The trio of Jawon Spinks, Layne Bodily and Jeremy Mares won the high jump with the combined total of 17 feet, 4 inches.

The Falcons also won the 6,400-meter relay in 19:24.4. Pat Lockhart turned in a leg of 4:42.7; Bryan Giglio ran 4:53.8; Ryan Kiblawi 4:56 and Chris Tobe 4:51.5.

The 600 relay went to the Farmington foursome of Mark Otach, Spinks, Dustin Gress and Todd Anthony with a time of 1:31.1. The same four also won the 400 in 44 seconds flat.

The Falcons won the long jump with a total distance of 57-2. Gress jumped 19-7, Spinks 19-8 and Eric Gaughan 19-1.

Farmington's three discus throwers took a third place with a total of 349-11. Rory Crittenden threw 144-6, Ben Lukas 112-3 and Delano Turner 99-2.

Farmington was third in the heavy man relay, and Lukas, Turner, Bodily and Crittenden teamed for a time of 1:47.9.

The Falcons were fourth in the 5,200 relay. Sean Kelly, Drew Martin, Andrew Casplicki and Chris McDonnell combined for 8:59.2 finish.

The team of Kiblawi, Tom Eason, Giglio and Tobe finished sixth in the distance medley relay. Their time was unavailable.

Spartans eliminate Marlins from tourney

Livonia Stevenson posted a 4-0 victory over host Farmington Hills Mercy in girls soccer Wednesday and advanced to the Division 1 district final Saturday at Southfield-Lathrup.

The game was stopped with 20 minutes remaining due to dangerous weather conditions.

Andi Sied, Cheryl Fox, Megan Urbata and Dana White scored goals for the No. 3-ranked Spartans, who take an 11-3-3 record into the championship game against Garden City.

Fox and Urbata also had two assists apiece. Stevenson goalkeeper Katherine Koch earned the shutout.

Spartans coach Jim Kimble said he has begun to refer to Urbata as Miss June, because her performance level in post-season play is outstanding.

"The past two years she has really dominated during the playoffs," Kimble said. "She's a determined kid and a good leader for us."

"She really stepped up, as did Andi Sied and Cheryl Fox, with the absence of Lindsay Guskic."

"It was good to see goal contributions from four people, but we had solid play from everyone across the field."

Guskic is competing in a tournament with the Olympic Development Program in Texas.

In a first-round tournament game Tuesday, Angie Trudeau and Carrie Kluska scored two goals apiece as host Mercy blanked Livonia Franklin, 9-0.

Scoring one goal apiece for the Marlins (10-6-3), who led 5-0 at halftime, were Marie Lentz, Deanna Glinther, Autumn Almas, Sue Roble and Carrie Denton. Lentz also assisted on two goals. Mercy goalkeepers Kristin Pimlott and Bridget Salvia shared credit for the shutout.

"We're talking about taking the next step next year. We have to do some growing to make up for the players we're losing."

"We have a lot to look forward to in that way. You have to go out this way, but what's done is done."
