

Hawks hammer Vikings, 10-0

Farmington Harrison pitcher Matt Zatkín raised his record to 5-0 when the Hawks merced Walled Lake Central in a non-league baseball game Thursday, 10-0.

Zatkín, who struck out two and didn't walk anybody, pitched the first three innings of the five-inning game played at the University of Michigan.


