## There's plenty to do before the fest

The official Farmington Area Family Fest doesn't begin until Thursday, June 22. But there's plenty to do the day before.

On Wednesday, June 21, there will be a downtown sidewalk sale, from 9 a.m. to dusk; a crafts show in the Big Apple Bagel parking lot and a fine arts show at Memorial Park, with both events scheduled from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.; the Miss Farmington/Oakland County pageant is 7 p.m. at the Civic Theater.

But Roger Ratkowski, owner of The Pasta Shop, is particu-

larly looking forward to the "Poker Walk" of downtown businesses (6 p.m.) and a '50s sock hop and classic car cruise from 7-11 p.m.

For the "Poker Walk," those who sign up at The Pasta Shop beginning at 5 p.m. Wednesday will receive a punch card. (The sign-up fee is \$5.)

Then, from The Pasta Shop (located at the southwest corner of Grand River-Farmington Road) participants will go to at least five downtown stores, and receive a single card. Ratkowski said the cost

for the first five cards is included in the sign-up fee.

If folks aren't happy with their hand at that point, they can continue to other stores.

The cost for each additional card, however, is \$5.

Those with the best poker hands will be eligible for prizes.

Meanwhile, Ratkowski said the owners of classic cars from the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s are being sought to participate in Wednesday's car cruise. Anyone who is interested is asked to call Ratkowski at 248-477-7600.

"We hope to have convertibles to pick up the girls and the (pageant) judges," Ratkowski said. "The dance is open to everyone and begins at 7 p.m."

### Opening number

The opening production number will have the girls dressed in black caprice pants and colorful shirts," said Jennifer Parks, a former Miss Kansas who joined the local pageant executive board last year.

She said the program will follow the basic pageant format — introduction of contestants, physical fitness, talent, evening gown, and interview. Reigning queen Leslie Reinbold will look back on her year as Miss Farmington, capped by this weekend's Miss Michigan pageant in Muskegon.

Last year the local pageant awarded \$4,000 in scholarships and the hope is to do the same this year. William Tyndale Col-

lege will again offer a \$5,000 scholarship if the winner attends the Farmington Hills Christian college.

Most of the 256 seats in the Civic Theatre are already sold for the evening. The pageant will be taped by the local cable TV company, which is prohibited by Miss America regulations from airing the production live. A spokeswoman for the Southwest Oakland Cable Commission said tapes will be made available for \$25.

Salon Legato which is next door to the theater, will operate as the backstage area for contestants.

"We're doing the hair, makeup and nails for the contestants," said Kelley Nowak, who co-owns the upscale full service salon with her husband, Mike.

Legato will offer a changing area to accommodate the girls as they transform from production number outfits to swimsuits, evening gowns and then business attire.

"We were approached by the pageant committee and we like doing things for the community," Nowak said.

The salon will close early to the public on Wednesday and she expects contestants will start arriving by 4 p.m.

"We also offered savings discounts for color and facials for contestants," she said.

Contestants include Victoria Anderson, Bristol Arnold, Sarah Burkett, Angela Corsi, Madonna Emond, Lauren Fisher, Francesca Romeo, Jennifer Smith, Erin Troxel and Pamela Walk. Ginny Morris is pageant executive director.
