Manure Thieves Strike

Thieves recently crept into a Farmington Township barnyard, carefully put down cardboard to prevent tire tracks and stole two yards of pig manure.

William Spess, of 32752 Fendt, told The Enterprise & Observer that he didn't report the incident to police, but he's sure people are trying to harass him.

"There must be some kind of cultural revolutionist out here," Spess said, "because they don't want pigs in Farmington Township."

SPESS SAID he has been pasturing animals for 35 years on a 10-acre parcel near Fendt and Drake.

"People want to change this area from farming to, risky houses, and they don't like my pigs," he said.

Spess, who was recently sentenced to 30 days in jail for dumping on Drake, has been involved in court battles over the use of property surrounding his farm.

Most of the problem has been over jurisdiction of county and township governments in naming Drake as a legal right-of-way.

SPESS THINKS that the manure theft is just another attempt at harassing township farmers, especially himself. When asked if the incident may have been a Halloween prank, he said:

"Do you think it's fun to shovel two yards of that stuff?"
