Experienced Rabbi
Still Is Student

Although still a student, serving as spiritual leader to a congregation is not new to Rabbi Steven Chester.

Before coming this year to Temple Beth Am, Livonia, he spent two years each at two congregations in southern California.

Born in St. Paul, in 1943, he made his home in the Los Angeles area for the past 16 years.

Rabbi Chester completed his undergraduate studies at UCLA, receiving a B.A. in history, and upon graduation entered the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and plans to be ordained in 1971.

He received a Bachelor of Hebrew Letters degree from that school in 1967 and was a co-winner of the faculty award for academic excellence.

Israel was the next place of study for Rabbi Chester. He spent a year at the Hebrew University and the Hebrew Union College. His major fields of study have been archaeology and Bible.

Rabbi Chester, who commutes to Livonia of alternate weekends, is presently in his third year of Rabbinic studies at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and plans to be ordained in 1971.

About eight years ago, eight people gathered in the living room of a member to organize the Faith Baptist Temple. From there, they went to a farm house on Grand River, and then to meeting in the Ten Mile Elementary School.

"Today, with a new building and a dedicated church has 35 members and a Sunday school of from 55 to 60, Junior high and senior high youth groups meet on Saturdays, and twice a month attend Yokes of Christian Youth meetings in the Mascoe Auditorium in Detroit.

The name was changed from Faith Baptist Temple to Faith Baptist Church. Although an independent organization, the church is in the Baptist Bible Fellowship.

"We anticipate great things in the future," stated the pastor, the Rev. Kenneth Thie, "Many things are being planned, with an emphasis upon the young people. The youth of today are our church of tomorrow, our country's and the world's hope.
