# Court-County Expand Mental Health Service

Expanded clinical mental health services have been announced by the Oakland County Community Health Services Board and the Oakland County Probate Court. The program is designed to expand the existing system of psychological clinics that provide mental health services for



service men in

Costs for the expanded services will be approximately \$25,000 for the next fiscal year, officials said. Funding will be 25 per cent by county and 75 per cent by state. "The expanded services are not intended to duplicate existing services but rather fill some of the service gaps and complement existing mental health services for the community," according to Charles Martinez of the agency.

Most services will go to the Juvenile Division of the Probate Court, he said.

It will be directed toward ersons who exhibit behavorial atterns that bring them toward r into conflict with the law.
