

Junior Miss Event Given New Date

Farmington Area Jaycees have moved ahead the deadline for entry in the Junior Miss Pageant. The deadline now is Nov. 20.

Eligible to enter the contest are senior high school girls aged 16-18 from Farmington and Clarencville School Districts. Entry blanks may be obtained at area high schools.

To be selected are 12 girls from three areas will be given a \$1,000 scholarship and will go on to compete for the national Junior Miss title and a \$10,000 scholarship in Mobile, Ala. on March 30.

Junior Miss will be held at 9 p.m. Nov. 30 in Farmington Junior High School. Winner of the local finals will receive a \$250 scholarship donated by Roger Peck Chevrolet.

In December, 12 finalists from three areas will be selected in Redford. These girls will compete in the state finals to be held in Pontiac in January.

'City Can't Pay Million For Road Work'—Dinan

Farmington City Manager John Dinan told the city planning commission Monday night that the budget couldn't stand an estimated \$1 million long range capital improvement program for roads.

Dinan told the planning commission that "With the city's present bonding capacity, we couldn't take on a million dollar obligation for the next 10 years."

He held out a ray of hope, however, that the money picture would brighten after the 1970 census when the city will receive more funds because its population has doubled in size.

THE MILLION dollar tag is for the city's share of improvement to county roads. It does not include repairs to streets under city jurisdiction.

It should be noted that Dinan's report was made on "long range" improvements. This leaves the possibility that the estimated cost will go up according to the commission.

roads needing improvement and costs include:

Ten Mile from Farmington Rd. to Orchard Lake -- widen to four lanes, five lanes at the Orchard Lake intersection, cost to the city, \$125,000.

*Orchard Lake from Grand River to 10 Mile -- widen, cost to the city \$250,000.

Farmington Rd. from Nine Mile to Grand River -- resurface to concrete, city's cost, \$40,000.

Grand River from 1-96 to Halstead -- resurface, city's cost, \$7,000.

Grand River from Halstead to Drake -- widen to four lanes, five lanes at the Drake intersection, city's cost, \$92,000.

Grand River from Drake to Gill -- widen to four lanes, five lanes at Drake, city's cost, \$42,500.

Grand River from Gill to Freedom -- resurface and resurfacing, city's cost, \$23,000.

Grand River from Farmington Rd. to Hawthorne -- repairs and resurfacing, cost \$62,000.

CITY STREETS Dinan designated as high priority for improvement were Sitawasee from Farmington Rd. to Grand River (cost, \$40,000 to \$50,000), and Gill from Grand River to Freedom (cost \$50,000).

Additional city streets cited as in need of improvement were: Drake from Grand River south to 1,000 feet north of Freedom; Thomas from Farmington Junior High to Farmington Rd.; Warsaw from Grand River to Thomas; Oakland from Farmington Rd. to Grand River; Freedom from Gill to Nine Mile; and Powers from Nine Mile to Grand River.

AFTER HEARING Dinan's report, Commission Chairman William L. Burke appointed a capital improvement committee. Members are Commissioners James Platt, chairman, Westcott Peterson, Richard Tupper and Jesse McDonald. Commissioner Russell Mil-

igan was taken off the capital improvement committee so that he could devote more time to heading the historical preservation committee.

In other business, the commission directed Dinan to obtain current plans of Chatham Hills Subdivision with emphasis placed on plans for flood control and park development.
