Sister Doelker said she volunteered the Mercy location. "We wanted to give them a place to have a program indoors. Mercy has an enrollment of about 940 girls; about 30 percent are minorities.

Included in the program will be several choral selections sung by students in the Wooddolfe Elementary School choir.

Refreshments will be served after the program. Candees will be provided by the Multicultural/Multiracial Community Coun-

cil.

The most famous part of the King speech, the Colsing, is being used on the invitations to the Parmington celebration:

"Let freedom ring. And when this happens, and when we allow freedom ring — when we let it ring from every village and every hander, from every state and every city, we will be able to speed up that day when all of God's children - black men and white men, Jews and Gentiles, Protestants and Catholics - will

be able to join hands and sing in the words of the old Negro spiritual: 'Free at last! Free at last! Thank God Almighty, we are free at last!'

The speech was also broadcast on TV and published in newspapers. King's 'I Have a Dream' speech has become one of the most famous public addresses of 20th century America.
