Farber won the individual medley and the breaststroke, and he contributed to a North victory in the medley relay. Sermet Alver won the 50 freestyle and also was part of the medley relay team with Brinn Claydon and Dan Goshorn. Craig Paske, Alver and Mahmud Bachouche joined Farber on the runner-up 400 freestyle relay team. "It was fun being in a good, close meet," Duthie said. "It was good for both teams. When you go down to Stevenson, you always expect good, hard-nosed competition, but it's always good sportsmanship. "I told the kids, 'I'm not excited about losing, but I am excited about the way we performed.' " PHOENIX WINS 2ND IN ROW: Coach Ross Bandy thought his unified Farmington-Harrison swim team had a good chance to win its next three dual meets, and so far he's been proven right. After facing many of the area heavyweights early in the season, the Phoenix earned its second straight victory Thursday, defeating Westland John Glenn in the Farmington High pool, 106-79. "We're starting to swim well now; so I'm real happy with that," Bandy said. "The kids are just putting a little more effort into it, knowing we have a shot at winning these meets. "We've got one more next week (Tuesday) versus Walled Lake Western at Farmington, and we're looking forward to that." Farmington-Harrison's Mark Benivagna won the 50 and 100 freestyle races, and he also helped the Phoenix win the 200 freestyle relay. Rob Gundlach took first place in the 200 freestyle, Kyle Chamberlin in the backstroke and Mike Baktik in the 200 freestyle. Benivagna's teammates on the relay were Charles DeMatia, Chris Vukovich and Mike Richardson. "We swam a lot better," Bandy said. "We had a lot of personal bests for this swim meet. "Paul Haapanelma's times in the 200 and 500 were personal bests, and Vukovich dropped three seconds in the butterfly. "Overall, it was probably the best we swam as a team. We're training real hard and looking for good things to happen on the end." CC COASTS TO WIN OVER HURON: Redford Catholic Central won every event on Thursday night in a roll past host Ann Arbor Huron, 139-48. "The kids love that pool and always seem to swim fast there," said CC coach Jeff Baker. "We swam much better than we did Tuesday night (in a loss) at Brother Rice. Top to bottom, we just dropped a whole bunch of times. It was nice to see them bounce back." Heik Markou posted two individual wins for the Shamrock (6-1 overall) as he took the 200 freestyle (1:51.32) and the 100 freestyle (50.65). Andrew Carlin won the 200 individual medley (2:06.24), Ed Lesnau the 50 freestyle (22.03), Jon Rohde diving (202.20), Brett Meconis the butterfly (53.26), Tim Ryan the 500 freestyle (5:17.34), Zach Fellrath the 100 backstroke (57.56) and Dan Diekman the 400 breaststroke (1:04.28). CC also won the 200 medley relay (Fellrath, Dziekan, Bryant Steele, Mike Greis; 1:44.92), the 200 freestyle relay (Lesnau, Kevin Ryan, Greis, Meconis; 1:30.85) and the 400 freestyle relay (Steele, Meconis, Markou, Lesnau; 3:23.46).
