Expanding restaurant chain specializes in soup to go or stay

t's hard to imagine eating chicken pot pie without a fork.

But spoon your way through a bowl of creamy chicken soup, loaded with vogetables and homemade crust, at Zoupi in Southfield, and you'll never go back to the traditional oven-baked version.

Chicken pot pie soup is a favorite and a fixture on the eatery's dozen soups-a-day menu that draws from more than 200 soup, stew and chili recipes made daily at Zoupl's Ferndale

The philosophy when we lay out the sough is to try to offer something for everyone," says cowner Eric Eraher, of Sylvan Lake, who founded Zoupl two years ago with David Elins, of Farmington Hills.

A recent menu included steak soup, four different chicken soups, two seafood soups, a chill and four vegetarian versions. The Chicken Pot Pie, thick, rich, but not overly creamy, lured me hoak to the restaurant for another bowl a few days after I first sampled it. The Mexican Chicken, a combination of corn, rice, green chili, jalapene, green peppers, chicken and spices in comato-based soup, delivered just the right amount of seet. But the Caribbean Seafood Chowder, loaded with seafood and vegetables in a thin soup, was too fishy for my taste. "We have chicken pot pie every day. We have to, by domand. The others rotate every day. We try to track favorites, Our customers very regularly tell us what they want and we adjust the menu to put them on more often. We found our customer base is pretty diverse.

On the menu: A dozen different soups, stews and chill creations deliy from an assortment of more than 200 recipes. Each soup comes with a hunk of multi-grain or sourdough bread. Beverages include sode pop, leed tea, hot tea, coffee, lemonade and bottled water. Cookles, brownles, mud pie, berry cobbler, apple brown betty and rice pudding are available for dessert. The Soup prices range from about \$3.25-\$4.25 for an eight-ounce coup. \$4.50-\$6.05 for a 16 ounce bowl and \$6.75-\$10.75 for a 32-ounce container.

The 2,200-square-foot space at 2873 Maple, just east of Coolidge, will seat about 25 people, about half of the available seating at Zoupi in Southfield. Customers will be able to order from the Troy menu in person, by fax or over the Internet, as they can from the other Zoupi sites. And they'll choose from 12 different soups daily, including low-fat, non-dairy, spicy and vegetarian, a variety of beverages and deseared. "The whole area there really is changing from light industrial to a higher end retail. There's new residential coming. It's a changing area. We're really excited about it." Ersher noted.
