Soon the pretty foliage will grow and cascade down the container. Use a clear one as you can see the roots as they develop. It likes regular house temperatures, somewhat cooler at night. A humidifier will supply additional moisture to the air. Use an all-purpose fertilizer through the year, more in the summer. When dried and ground up avocado leaves give a somewhat nutty, anise-like flavor and are often used in Mexican cuisine. A thin-skinned black avocado has the best flavor.

Use this same technique to prepare sweet potato slips to grow in the garden, although you'll need to time it so they will be ready for the garden after the

When the green shoots are about 4 to 5 inches long, gently twist them from the section of potato. Collect the shoots and

put them in a container of ware so that only their bottom halves are immersed.

In just a few days roots will appear. Keep the roots cut so they don't get longer than an inch or two before planting.


