did an analysis after one year of the using the video and found a reduction of 30 percent in injuries among new employees."

The Arbor Awards for excellence is given annually to recognize organizations that apply innovative programs and "best practices" as well as a professional excellence in the advancement of effective human resources management within their organizations, said Joan Moore, president of the Arbor Consulting Group.

"It was great to receive the Arbor Award. I think what impressed me most was our ability to win an award alongside large companies like GM, Toyota, Borders, who all have large staffs with big budgets to complete their projects. Comparatively, we used a committee that meets once a month, with a small budget to complete our award winning project," said Al Rackov.

Kerosene could be contaminated

Kerosene bought recently from a Clark gas station in Livonia may be dangerously contaminated and should not be used, a company official said Tuesday.

The tainted fuel was delivered about 1 p.m. Saturday to the Clark station on the southwest corner of Eight Mile and Merriam, said John Matthews, vice president for marketing and corporate communications at Clark

Retail Enterprises.

The problem kerosene ignites at a different temperature than regular kerosene and could pose a fire hazard, Matthews said. Any kerosene bought from the station after 1 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 24, should be returned for a refund, he said.

"We've just got to make sure people don't use it," Matthews said.

About 60 gallons of the kerosene were sold before the problem was discovered, he said. Those sales were in cash - meaning company officials can't trace the people who made the purchases, he said.

Matthews was unsure how the kerosene was contaminated. The company is working to find out how the bad kerosene came to be delivered, he said.

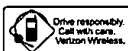
