Officials hope to expand grad survey

The results of the latest Farmington graduate sur-vey are in, but officials say it'll take a few years of comparison to get mean-ingful answers.

Start Wairin ismitheos.bomecomm.net The percentage of 1999 Farmington Public Schools graduates reporting their high school experience was a ful-illing one has dropped, compared to a imilar survey of 1998 grads. But school officialis caution against jumping to conclusions because of the survey comparison, outlined during the Feb. 27 school board meeting. They snid one reason for the year-to-year fluctuation is the fact the number of alumni completing the survey - offered one year after graduation - was double that of the first attempt, in summer 1999. An aggressive marketing campaign increase participation to as high as 30 percent, which would be considered a more meaningful sampling, said Susan Zurvalee, the district's assistant super-intendont for staff and community ser-vices.
