HGTV's Duvall to demonstrate crafts

Carol Duvall, host of Home and Garden Television's (HGTV) "The Carol Duvall Show" will make a homecoming to the Detroit area in March during Henry Ford Museum's Family Fun Month.

On Saturday, March 10, Duvall, who got her crafts start in Michigan, will give five craft demonstrations, highlighting some of her more popular crafts featured on her shows over the years. Show times are 10 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m., 2 p.m. and 3 p.m.

Demonstrations will take place in the Great Hall of the museum and cover kids crafts, and upcoming holiday crafts for the whole family. Duvall will give the demonstration and then take questions from the audience. (The demonstration is free with admission to the museum.)

"We are very excited to welcome Carol Duvall back home to Detroit," said Tom Stoll, special programs leader for Henry Ford Museum. "With the popularity of

crafts in today's hobby industry, we are expecting a lot of her fans to come out and meet her in person."

Carol Duvall has held the reign of "Craft Queen" on television for 40 years as the original craft demonstrator, entertaining and encouraging millions of do-it-yourselfers. She began her career as host of a children's television show in Grand Rapids. In 1962, she moved to Detroit television and spent 18 years hosting and co-producing a talk show, writing and producing specials, co-anchoring the news, and hosting and producing her first craft-oriented show, "Here's Carol Duvall."

In the 1980s, she brought crafting to national television on ABC's "The Home Show." In 1994, she became host of "The Carol Duvall Show" on HGTV.

After they see Carol Duvall, children and adults alike can put their knowledge to the test, during the "Crafty Capers" weekend demonstrations on

March 10 and 11. Visitors can try their hand at such museum craft projects as:

■ Paper to Fly and Wear - Make hats and airplanes out of paper. All day.


■ Baubles, Bangles and Things for Your Pockets - Design your own jewelry from buttons, beads and baubles. Make a lace up wallet and drawstring purse. All day.

■ Land of Make-Believe - Craft a paper and yarn doll or pipe cleaner animal. All day.

■ What Do You See? - Come together for a group sketching activity for children eight and older. 1 and 2:30 p.m.

Henry Ford Museum, in Dearborn, is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., seven days a week. The museum offers free parking and is located at 20900 Oakwood Boulevard at Village Road, west of the Southfield Freeway and south of Michigan Avenue.




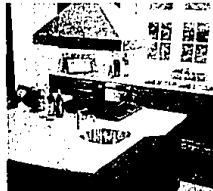
