POLICE CALLS

The following incidents were recently reported to the Farmington Hills Police Department:

RETAIL FRAUD

A 25-year-old Detroit woman was arrested for retail fraud Tuesday, April 24, after taking merchandise without paying for it from Kohl's, 30160 Grand River and returning the items for a refund.

A Kohl's security officer told police that the woman received a cash refund for a slow cooking pot worth \$39.99 and store credit for sports apparel worth about \$25.44. She was picked up by Wayne County sheriff's deputies for a probation violation on an unrelated case.

LARCENIES

Two men reportedly made off with a lawn edger worth an estimated \$500 after removing it from a tool shed at Village Green Apartments, 28418 Eight Mile. The shed's lock was broken, sustaining about \$25 in damage. A maintenance worker told police that he saw two men near the tool shed and asked them what they were doing.

They told him they were picking up the edger, which was reportedly sitting in their vehicle's trunk. They drove away. The maintenance worker described the men's vehicle as an older model four-door Buick but could not provide a license plate number.

TIRES STOLEN

Two tires and wheels worth an estimated \$600 were reportedly removed from the left side of a 1994 Chrysler parked in the 23000 block of Middlebelt sometime before Wednesday, April 25. The vehicle was left sitting with a concrete block underneath, causing damage to the left rocker panel.

Two tires worth an estimated \$400 and two wheels worth an estimated \$400 were reportedly removed from a Pontiac Grand Am GT parked in the 31000 block of 12 Mile sometime before Thursday, April 26, leaving the vehicle standing on a concrete block.

A police report stated that similar incidents involving Pontiac Grand Am's have been reported in the 12 Mile/Orchard Lake area over the past few months.

VANDALISM

Two street lamps leading into the Camelot Court subdivision, at 11 Mile and Arden Park, were damaged before Tuesday, April 24.

A police report stated that glass on all four sides of each lamp was broken, sustaining an undisclosed amount of damage. The resident reporting the damage told police that this was the second incident in the past three months.

LAWN STATUE TAKEN

Someone reportedly removed a 4-foot Indian figure cement statue from a porch of a 33000 Har-

lowshire residence Wednesday, April 25. The homeowner told police they saw a dirty four-door Pontiac Bonneville parked in front with a man and woman inside. The man got out, walked up to the porch and took the statue and ran to the car. The statue was worth an estimated \$100.

VEHICLE BREAK-INS

Someone reportedly removed an owner's manual worth an estimated \$25 from the glove compartment of a Jeep parked in the 28800 block of Middlebelt Wednesday, April 25. There was about \$150 in damage to a door lock.

FIREARM ARREST

A 28-year-old Southfield man was cited for carrying a concealed weapon, not possessing a valid driver's license and for driving with a suspended license Wednesday, April 25.

During a traffic stop and subsequent vehicle search to which the man reportedly gave consent, police recovered a semi-automatic handgun with the serial numbers filed off as well as numerous Social Security cards and driver's licenses.

DRUG ARRESTS

A 19-year-old Redford man was cited for possession of marijuana and for failing to yield to traffic Wednesday, April 25, at Grand River and Jacksonville. During a police search of the man's person police reportedly

recovered marijuana, which had been placed in a cigarette box.

Hills police responding to a disorderly person complaint Thursday, April 26, at Motel 6, 38300 Grand River, wound up arresting two women for possession of narcotics.

While questioning a 25-year-old Inkster woman and a 32-year-old Milford woman, an officer reportedly spotted a marijuana pipe sitting on a pile of clothes in a basket.

An officer also reportedly witnessed the Inkster woman passing an object to the Milford woman, which turned out to be a packet of heroin. The Milford woman said another packet of heroin was hidden in a toilet paper roll in the bathroom, which police recovered.

The Westland woman had outstanding warrants from Westland. A third motel guest, a 35-year-old Farmington Hills man who appeared not to be involved, was released.
