"Someone filed a complaint and a hearing was held without notice. It was a 'Star Chamber' suspension,' Taylor said.

SWOCC alleged in the letter that the show violated their policity which prohibits drugs of alcolo and the premises.

Taylor said, "Police from Novi bring drugs in to show people all the time. This is content-based discrimination and is patently unfair."



A parent or legal guardian must accompany any child seek-ing a helmet and show proof of Farmington Hills residency.

According to the SafeMichigan Partnership, "bicycles are associated with more childhood injuries than any other con-sumer product except the auto-mobile.

Universal bicycle helmet use

for children aged 4-15 would prevent 136-155 deaths per year."

Dwyer said, "It's easy to see why this issue is of such concern to us. We should all do what we can to ensure that our children are protected."

Last year the Farmington Hills Police Department dis-tributed more than 1,600 hel-mets to local children.
